



Dear parents,

		<b>What We Need</b>

Most Children and Infants Tylenol/Motrin say "must consult the doctor under two years old." <b>We must have a doctor's note with the dosage amount before we can give these drugs.</b></p> <p>This is to prevent overdose.</p> <p>Per state standard, we cannot administer drugs to a child to reduce a fever. The child must be fever free in order for us to provide care or administer meds.</p> <p>Our Medicine Sheet must also be completed for the dates the medicine is needed only.</p>
